The Spiritual Life of Children

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the people of Judea expected a military conqueror. They welcomed him with palm leaves as a hero who would lead them to fight battles. They felt low in status as a conquered people. They looked to Jesus to raise their status. Palm Sunday is a day in the Christian year when God invites us to question our expectations.

Jesus didn't meet the expectations of most people in the crowd that day. Instead of showing them that true greatness comes from the ability to show violence and control riding in on a war horse, surrounded by soldiers, he rode in on a borrowed donkey with unarmed disciples to show them that true greatness comes from humility.

Throughout his ministry Jesus had invited his disciples and followers to imagine true greatness as humility. Jesus asks us to reflect on the importance of children in our lives to help us understand the expectations God has for us as his disciples.

Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me. Matthew 8:4-5

When he entered into Jerusalem, we read that children recognized Jesus as the messiah he truly is while many of the religious leaders are confused and angry with Jesus.

The blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he cured them. ¹⁵But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the amazing things that he did, and heard the children crying out in the temple, 'Hosanna to the Son of David', they became angry ¹⁶and said to him, 'Do you hear what these are saying?' Jesus said to them, 'Yes; have you never read,

"Out of the mouths of infants and nursing babies you have prepared praise for yourself"?

¹⁷He left them, went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there. Matthew 21:14-17

Over the next several weeks we will be discussing how we mature in our spiritual lives as we go through the aging process. How each stage of life has opportunities and challenges. What do children teach about faith in God? Humility, trust, unconditional love, acceptance, to expect great things.

If children are surrounded by loving, healthy adults they can display great trust in others and unconditional love. They can display great dependence, trust and love for God with depth of emotion.

The children of black, brown, or white parents will play with each other and become wonderful friends unless they are taught prejudice by adults. The acceptance that young children show to us as adults is that each person is valued by God for who we are, not the work we do or what we accomplish.

One of our primary goals of ministry as a church at the First UMC Warrensburg is to raise the next generation in faith. We understand that in the early years of a child's life,

there is a wonderful opportunity to help them develop faith that will last a lifetime.

Goals for the spiritual life of children:

- Know that God loves them for who they are not what they do.
- Know that their family loves them.
- Know that their church family loves them and is there for them.
- Create fun environments for them to develop, friendships with other children, youth, and adults in the church family.
- Encourage our children to enjoy praying, reading the Bible, singing songs of faith, spending time with other Christians, spending time in church, giving to God financially, serving other people, being comfortable talking about God with other people,

In preparing for today's message, I called and spoke with Sally Hart. Most Sundays, she and her husband John are in church with their kids and their grandkids, supporting each other in their faith formation.

She told me that she and John came to church every Sunday with their kids when they were young with the hope that they would continue this practice throughout their lives. Through Sunday School, mission trips, youth group and lots of things, lots of people knew their kids. All of these people have looked after them and helped them grow into adults. Their children learned from adult Christians that were doing good things for other people the importance of caring for others. Sally's dream is that her children and grandchildren will all believe in Jesus throughout their lives and continue to grow in faith by regularly coming to church.

As Vada, our children and young families minister, and I were preparing for today's message, we thought it would be good to encourage families to reflect on positive experiences that they have had in their church family. We ask you to dream and pray about what experiences you want your kids to have in our church.

When we invest in the lives of children, our own, or God's children from other families, we become more like Jesus. We share Jesus with them during a critical period in their development.

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and Jesus's triumphal entry in Jerusalem, let's pray that we can develop a little more humility, more dependence on God, more of the trust of a child.
