Don't Be Afraid

My brother Phil lived for several years in South America teaching English as a second language. He taught several hundred students over the course of three years. He told me that in his observation, the students who continue to learn a language and improve share one quality in common. Do you want to guess what it is?



The willingness to be afraid and keep moving forward.

My brother told me that when it was time to learn and practice, most of his students would freeze up. They were afraid. Afraid of making mistakes.

The students who moved through their fear made a million

mistakes. They would embarrass themselves terribly. But they would progressively grow in understanding of the language. The impossible became possible. The possible became fun and then a joy to share with others.

Have you ever been afraid? Have you ever felt like the world was moving under your feet? You are in good company. When Jesus was arrested, and put on trial and crucified, his disciples were so afraid that they went into a room and hid. They were paralyzed.

Why do we have fear?

Fear can be helpful. It's a gift from God if we can master it rather than letting fear master us. Fear can help us to consider our options. Fear can help us to consider carefully taking out a loan and our ability to invest the funds and pay back the loan.

Fear can help us to avoid danger. As I've talked with parents over the years and become a parent myself, I've noticed a nuanced relationship with fear and adventure. I was at a pool party years ago where a dad told me that he wanted his kids to feel confident to swim in the water and explore *but* he wanted them to have a healthy fear of water as they were still learning how to swim. He wanted them to enjoy a lifetime of exploring while avoiding the danger of drowning in infancy.

Fear can be helpful. But we don't want fear to be the end of our story. The story of Easter is that God doesn't want us to be immobilized by our fear.

As a staff and church we often tell each other, **failure is okay—failing to try is not.**

Fear is inevitable. We were created by God to experience fear. But what does the resurrection of Jesus from the dead tell us about how God calls us to respond to our fear?

When Jesus was arrested and crucified, most of the disciples ran away and hid. They probably all felt like the world was moving underneath their feet.

But a few of the disciples--two disciples, two women--remembered Jesus's promise that he would overcome death. They remembered God's promise of a new world. They were afraid, but they pushed through their fear trusting in the promises of God. They were afraid, but they took the first step. They kept moving. God takes over and brings them new hope.

But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him." This is my message for you.'⁸ So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Matthew 28:5-8

In this passage from Matthew, we read over and over again, don't be afraid. The author tells us that the women follow the angels and instructions and go to share the amazing news that through the power of Jesus life has overcome death. The author reminds us that as they are quickly going to accomplish this task, they were afraid, but they also were filled with joy. Because they pushed through their fear, they offered hope to the other disciples. They helped them to move out of their fear, to change the world.

Why does the resurrection have meaning for us today?

The resurrection of Jesus gives us the power to live as God calls us to. Even when we are lost, afraid, without hope, Jesus offers us the strength to keep moving. Jesus isn't offended by our fear. Ask for Jesus's help. Pray, yes, I am afraid. Guide me through my doubts, my fears.

When we baptize our children, we are saying, God I know I'm not a perfect parent, but I'm pushing through my fear, taking a step forward, calling on your grace to guide me to be the best parent that I can be. I want you, Jesus, to help me raise my children in love. I trust in you. I'm taking a step forward.

When we choose to be confirmed, we are saying, "I want to give my life to Jesus." I want to choose for myself as an adult to trust in God in the way that my parents and family and church family have showed me their trust in God. I trust that just as Jesus showed the disciples a way forward, God will guide me into a brighter future than I can imagine.

The message of Easter. The meaning of Jesus's resurrection is life overcomes death. Faith overcomes doubt. Hope overcomes fear.
