Pastor Peter's message notes from Feb. 6, 2022

Let's Talk It Out: I Disagree and I Love You

Several years ago, I was in a class when a student started a presentation by asking the question, "How many of you know someone with whom you agree on every topic?" This question really woke us up. As we discussed this question, we realized that we didn't know any two people that completely agreed about every topic. Even married couples I know well that share decades of their lives together, who sacrifice and pursue common goals, always have some areas of disagreement. Haven't you found this to be the case?

When I help couples prepare for marriage through premarital discussions, one of the things we discuss is how to communicate with each other around big topics and how to stay in love when you inevitably disagree. This is hard work. But with God's grace, we can disagree and stay in love.

The book of James offers us guidance on how to disagree and continue to love each other. "You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness." James 1:19-20

The United Methodist Church understands itself as a church in which people can agree about core beliefs, disagree about non-essentials, and continue in unity and mission to serve God and neighbor. One of my coaches, Aaron Brown, the lead pastor of Woods Chapel UMC, has said in many sermons, "Jesus calls us to unity, not uniformity."

John Wesley studied and learned from Christians of all different backgrounds: Eastern Orthodox, German pietists, Moravians. He was educated at Oxford and ordained in the church of England. He read heavily in the works of the early church. He drew on the faith and knowledge of people of faith from a variety of different traditions who held different ideas and beliefs. He was always seeking to understand the core of Christianity with a focus on how people of faith could serve together to transform the world.

There are certain beliefs that are core to our identity as Christians in the United Methodist tradition. For example, we believe that salvation is available to all people through Jesus Christ. This is gift that we receive but can never earn. We believe that faith must be expressed in mission and service to the world.

"While it is true that United Methodists are fixed upon certain religious affirmations, grounded in the gospel and confirmed in their experience, they also recognize the right of Christians to disagree on matters such as forms of worship, structures of church government, modes of baptism, or theological explorations. They believe such differences do not break the bond of fellowship that ties Christians together in Jesus Christ. Wesley's familiar dictum was, "As to all opinions which do not strike at the root of Christianity, we think and let think." Book of Discipline 2016, Our Doctrinal Heritage, page 56.

The first question we should ask ourselves is not, "Where do we disagree?" The question we should first ask ourselves is, "How can we work together to accomplish God's mission in our hurting world?"
