

October's Disciple Gift for Homeless:

Monetary gifts designated locally for Journey Home, Refuge on Ming

Discussing the homeless issue within this community is not comfortable, esp. when discussing it with others. Recent conversations have shared that authorities in the city are putting homeless individuals on buses or the train and sending them to Warrensburg. Many arrive and do not even know where they are.

The reasons people become homeless are varied. Some have mental issues that limit their ability to function in society. Some have jobs but cannot afford to maintain a residence with the minimum salary. In today's society, others have become homeless as a result from the effects of COVID.

Two local agencies focus on assisting the homeless in Warrensburg. One is Journey Home and the second is Refuge on Ming. The monetary gifts will be divided between these two sites.

As both of these sites are primarily grant-funded, the monetary donations will assist in meeting the required matching funds for the grants and/or additional operational expenses.

Sunday, Oct. 9, Erica Collins will share more about Journey Home. Journey Home needs white bedding, towels, and bleach—as everything is bleached. Donations may be left in the atrium.

Additional items to donate includes good, warm, used clothing. These items, too, may be left in the atrium.

A shared passion in history, esp. local history, put Chuck Linville into a conversation with Andrea that led to the latest display at the Lone Jack Museum and then a day trip to the museum on Saturday, Oct. 1.

The two men fighting on the battlefield were from this church's congregation. When Emory Foster (right) was injured, Vard Cockrell (left) put aside the political differences and set out to save his wounded friend.
