

# UMCburg's ministry for the MVCAA continues essential life-changing work

Knowing the stories of the MVCAA's work to understand the importance of supporting this organization through the month's disciple gift. The staff has provided some stories of that have developed over the past year. As you consider your gift, consider this example of MVCAA work:

"In January, the agency helped an elderly gentleman who had lived in Warrensburg before, was a good tenant and never late on rent.

His wife lived with him but was taken out west somewhere by family members due to mental issues. Later, he went to live with his daughter out of state for about five years. A few months ago, he showed up in this area with no place to stay.

It is said a group of firemen in the other state pooled their monies together and put him on a bus to get him here. The only information he had in his wallet lead to this area, with his old address from when he lived at the apartment complex before.

We worked in partnership with a Care Connections worker to help him get into an apartment. We used family support funds to assist with his rent and deposit."



#### Safety Team announces continued work

Over the last two years the security committee has been making strides to ensure all our congregants and visitors have a safe place to worship.

The next phase will begin on December 18 during the worship service. Currently the Gay Street sanctuary doors are locked after service begins, so the Playground doors will also be locked once the service begins. The only door to enter once the service starts will be the North Atrium Doors.

As part of that initiative we are now seeking to establish a safety team. The team would consist of church members who are physically capable, qualified to serve, and willing to respond to the safety needs of the church on Sundays.

The incidents can range from assisting congregants with a medical event to evacuations during a fire or Active Shooter. Above all we are seeking people lovers with a drive to help others. Through diligence this team can help prevent incidents.

Friday, December 9, Steve Mills will begin the first day of work on the Methodist Clinic in Falmouth, JA. He said the team hopes to prepare the clinic in order for UMCburg's medical and construction team to

resume a mission trip during the week of March 6.
