Palm Sunday

Learning about CROP Hunger Walks

Several members of our church family are involved in the ministry CROP Hunger Walk. This month's disciple gift is this ministry and on Saturday, April 29, walkers will join together to walk in an effort to raise money for the hungry in our community.

The link provided above will make it possible for you to locate a team that is walking and you can join them along the walk or by supporting them with a pledge.

CROP Hunger walk began in 1969 when a thousand people in Bismarck, ND, walked and raised \$25,000 to help stop hunger. Think what that total would mean to a community over 50 years ago!

The name CROP is an acronym which means Christian Rural Overseas Program. In 1947, the mission for this was to help Midwest farm families share their grain with hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia.

Today's CROP walks are interfaith groups in communities who work to educate others about hunger and to raise funds to the needs of hungry. From the web site, it states, "... each local CROP Hunger Walk can choose to return up to 25% of the funds it raises to hunger fighting programs in its own community.

As April is the month the disciple gift team identified for CROP, please make your donation either through the church's website, or you can provide a donation of cash or check by mailing it to the church or dropping off in the offering plates on Sundays. Remember, too, Kids Can Do will collect that loose change on the $4^{\rm th}$ Sunday of April, which will be the day after the local hunger walk.

Giving to God's Work_

Recently Dale Carder spoke during worship concerning 'gift annuities.' This may be an unfamiliar term for you, so he has shared some frequently asked questions and answers from the Missouri United Methodist Foundation. Over the next few newsletters, some of those questions and answers will be included:

Q. What is a gift annuity?

A. It is a simple agreement that combines a charitable gift with a fixed income annuity payment.

Q. How do I create a gift annuity for my church?

- 1) Contact Missouri UM Foundation for information and materials. Discuss this information with your own trusted advisors
- 2) Complete the application and send it in with you gift (cash or appreciated stock are most common).

Q. Is there a minimum gift amount?

A. Yes. To create a first gift annuity, requires at least \$10,000. Subsequent gift annuities can be created with at least \$5.000.

Q. How is the payment amount determined?

A. The payments are determined by the age of the annuitant(s) at the time of the gift. The payments remain fixed for the life of the annuitant(s). The rates are determined by the American Council on Gifts.

More Q&A will be shared in the next few newsletters. If you have additional questions on the process, please contact Dale Carder or Robyn Criswell-Bloom. They have gone through training with the Missouri United Methodist Foundation in order to help the church members understand how to implement gift annuities.

Nominating Season Now Open

Each member of the body of Christ is given gifts and a mission. Some are called to feed the hungry, to preach, to visit people in the hospital.

There are many different ways that Christians can serve. In the United Methodist Church, some mature Christians are called to the ministry of strategically leading the church through service in the areas of finance, trustees, pastor parish relations, and nominating new leaders.

Each year new leaders are nominated to these areas of leadership to serve a three-year term on the finance, trustees, pastor parish relations, and nominating committees.

During the months of March and April, the nominating committee will be accepting nominations for committee leaders.
