Why I Love Being a Methodist-My mother always took my brothers, my sister, and me to the local Methodist Church as far back as I can remember. The hymns were familiar and comforting, the pastors were always kind, and the teachings in Sunday School were also familiar and comforting. The parishioners were friendly and welcoming. Every

service that I can remember ended with a hymn and an altar call. The altar calls were an invitation to accept Jesus as Savior, and to join the church and be baptized. It was always a sober time when we looked deep inside our hearts to consider what we were called to do for Christ, and how we were to live our lives. If we had preparation classes in the early 50s, I'm not aware of it. I do know that one Sunday I was called to choose Christ and have never looked back. I don't mean that I suddenly became the really good person that I would like to be, but I have kept trying to be. The Methodist Church has always provided a place for me: Sunday school (to this day), weekly church, MYF and evening services, and in college, Wesley Foundation (where I met my husband Jerry of 64 years), and a church where our two children were reared and baptized. There are so many places to serve here in the church and community. Just listen or ask. I have not always agreed with the Methodists, but it has been a place of belonging and a place to find God. I followed my mother's example and am trying to follow Christ's example. I am truly blessed! **Judy Murray**
